She acknowledges knowing little about her Indigenous neighbours nor giving much thought to the impact of her actions as a social worker removing "at risk" Indigenous children from their families. She worked for the federal government in Northern Manitoba early in her career, later living in Williams Lake, BC amongst another Indigenous community. She has come to understand and reflect on the insidious nature of prejudice and ongoing racism, thus committing to the advocacy journey she is now on.
