

## Ukulele workshops at St. Andrew's – led by Rev. Geoffrey!

Congratulations! You clicked on the link that led you to the first step of learning how to play the ukulele!

Fun fact: ukulele is pronounced with the first vowel being like an “oo” sound, not like “you”. So, oo-koo-leh-leh,” not YOU-koo-LAY-lee.”

Fun fact two: I will be learning with you. I play the guitar and will be learning the ukulele as we go.

If you are ready to give it a whirl or a twirl, you will need to borrow, buy, or rent your own ukulele. I recommend Long and McQuaid, whose Chinook location is convenient to the church. [There you will find ukuleles](#) for as little as \$45, with one particularly nice one available for \$80. (The blue one is plastic, and the brown one is mahogany.)



Ukuleles can also be rented; I have been quoted rates from \$8 to \$15 per month, so I am not quite sure how much you will be charged. You might want to rent for starters and if you like it, you can probably apply the cost of rental to a purchase.

One other consideration that might make you want to rent instead of buy: the soprano ukes are the least expensive but they are not the easiest to play. So consider renting a soprano uke and check out the baritones as we go.
